## International Workshop on Evolutionary Economics for PhD students and Post-Docs

The "7<sup>th</sup> Buchenbach Workshop on evolutionary economics for young economists" will be held as an international conference in Buchenbach (Black Forest), **October 4 - 8, 2005**. PhD students and Post-Docs from all European countries who work in the field of evolutionary economics are invited to present their research and discuss with internationally distinguished specialists in the field. Keynote lectures on central topics like history and economic theory, growth and development, business history, and the policy implications of the evolutionary approach will be given by Richard Day (USA), Alexander Field (USA), Patrick Llerena (F), Stanley Metcalfe (GB), Peter Murmann (USA), Richard Nelson (USA), Hansjörg Siegenthaler (CH), and Ulrich Witt (D).

The conference is organized by Professor Marco Lehmann-Waffenschmidt, Technical University of Dresden, in collaboration with Professor Ulrich Witt, Evolutionary Economics Group, Max-Planck-Institute, Jena. Conference language is English. Full boarding costs at the conference site for the conference will be approx. € 160, financial support for the participants may be made available.
